

# LAC GUIDELINES

## Guidelines for the Lakeview Archery Club Shooter of the Year Program

1. Lakeview Archery Club will have as a goal to conduct at least four club tournaments per year. If the club is unable to conduct four tournaments, the *Shooter of the Year Award* will still be based on those tournaments conducted.
2. The format and rules of each tournament will be consistent with that of the Southern Circuit Men's Hunter Classification unless otherwise determined by majority vote at an announced club meeting.
3. While any member or guest may compete in a club tournament, only those club members in good standing at the time of the first tournament of the year shall be eligible for the *Shooter of the Year Award*.
4. *Shooter of the Year Award* standing and final results will be determined by the cumulative total of the club tournaments for that calendar year.
5. Ties will be determined by the total number of 12's scored.
6. A shooter missing a club tournament is still eligible for the *Shooter of the Year Award* but will be given a "0" for that tournament.
7. For any club member, the lowest scored shoot (including "0's") will be dropped from the total cumulative score for the year. This will allow any shooter to miss one of the scheduled tournaments and still be in contention for the *Shooter of the Year Award*.
8. The Shooter of the Year Award will be presented to the recipient at an annual banquet in January or February of the year following the year in which it was won or at a time and place determined by the club membership.

## Club Participation Incentives

The purpose of the Lakeview Archery Club is to advance archery in all forms and to establish a club fellowship for our members to enjoy our sport in a fun, safe and challenging setting. In addition to our purpose, Chester State Park affords us the privilege of utilizing the park facilities with the obligation that we maintain the park Archery Range. To satisfy our purpose and park obligations, participation by club members in planned work days, to the extent possible, is expected.

As an incentive for club members to participate, those meeting the following participation expectations will be invited, along with their immediate family members, to the annual club banquet at no expense to the member. All other members will be invited as well but will be expected to pay the dinner expenses for themselves and their family.

### Participation Expectations:

1. Work days include circuit tournament setup days, circuit tournament days, organized range work days, or other designated work days as specified by the club President. (note: A typical tournament includes three work days; Friday, Saturday and Sunday.)
2. Club tournaments are not considered work days unless they are held in conjunction with other designated work activities as specified by the club President.

3. To get credit for a work day, a member must be present and actively helping for at least half of the work activities for that day.
4. If a member is forced to miss a work day due to schedule conflicts, that member may make arrangements, in advance, to work another day, independently, on tasks specifically identified by the club President. Credit for alternate work days is contingent on successful completion of the agreed to work tasks. The club is not obligated to make alternate work days available and will only do so if there is a legitimate work need.
5. Each member is expected to participate in at least 70% of the scheduled work days in any given year.

Example: In a given year, the club hosts three circuit tournaments (nine work days) and has 5 other scheduled work days to work on range targets for a total of 14 work days in the year. A member work all 3 days for 2 tournaments plus 4 of the 5 range target work days totaling 10 works days. Since this member has worked 10 of 14 work days, or 71% of the total work days that year, he has met the participation expectations.
